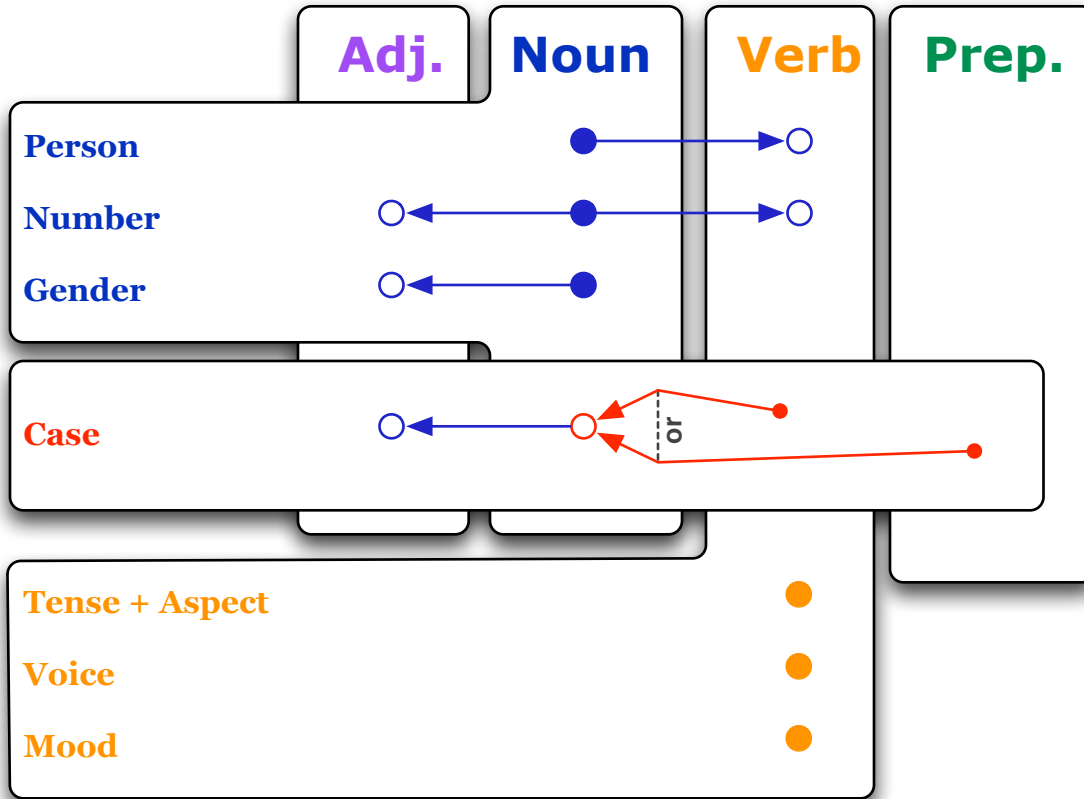


# Latin Agreement and Case



A ← B  
A agrees with B

A verb agrees with its subject.

An adjective agrees with the noun that it modifies.

A ← B  
B assigns case to A

Verbs and prepositions assign case to their objects (which are nouns).

## Case Assignment

### Verbs

#### Noun Function

subject  
direct object  
indirect object

#### Case

nominative  
accusative  
dative

### Prepositions

#### Meaning Family\*

"towards"  
"away from"

#### Case

accusative  
ablative

A verb assigns case to its subject, direct object, and indirect object (if any). These are nouns.

\* Each preposition assigns a case. A preposition's meaning family doesn't always tell you which case it assigns, but it's a good rule of thumb.
